Who is CCTA?

The Contra Costa Transportation Authority (CCTA) partners with cities and transit agencies to plan, fund, and implement transportation projects and programs that strengthen our diverse communities and improve the lives of residents.



Four principles shape CCTA's work



Safe Travel

Traveling in my community is safe and comfortable, no matter how I get around.

Access for All

I can shape and access transportation projects and programs that improve my community.

Livable and Connected Neighborhoods

I have convenient and comfortable options for how I travel to places that are important to me.

Growing Sustainably

I feel confident that transportation investments in Contra Costa will help provide a sustainable future for my community.

CCTA is funded by Measure J

Measure J is a countywide half-cent sales tax approved by voters in November 2004. It provides about \$2.5 billion for countywide and local transportation projects and programs, and expires in 2034.
